How are you? (Formal)
¿Qué tal? ¿Cómo está? ¿Cómo le va?

Good afternoon = Buenas tardes
(After noon and until it's dark)

Good evening (from when it gets dark)
and good night = buenas noches

Please = Por favor

Thanks = gracias
Thanks very much = muchas gracias

You're welcome = De nada

Yes = Sí
No, not = No
